

Sgt. James Hrabik Killed in France

Mrs. James Hrabik, jr., daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Zulkoski, received a telegram from the war department last Thursday stating that her husband, Sgt. James Hrabik, jr., was killed in action somewhere in France on July 11.

Before going to France Sgt. Hrabik was stationed at numerous camps in this country, having entered the service in February, 1942, and he had been in England for four months before the invasion.

Sgt. Hrabik was a resident of Omaha before entering the service and there he met and was married to Bernice Zulkoski who was employed in Omaha at the time. She has been living with her parents west of Elyria since her husband was sent overseas.



He was in the 30th Division, an infantry unit which landed in France soon after D-day.

Rosary was recited at the J. B. Zulkoski home Sunday evening and memorial services were held at the Elyria Catholic church at 9:00 Monday morning.

Sgt. Hrabik leaves, besides his wife and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Hrabik, sr., of Omaha, four sisters and five brothers. They are Mrs. Mildred Melia, Gretna, Nebr., Mrs. Evelyn Moody, Omaha, WAVE Ruth H. Peterson, Hawthorne, Nev., and Sandra, Kenneth, Vernon, Richard, Donald and Edward, all at home.
